Plan Focus

- Institute protocols for the health and well-being of all constituents
- Ensure a culture of care in and out of school
- Continue to plan for and provide an exceptional learning experience for all students





Social Distancing

- All classrooms have been arranged in keeping with the regulations of 6 feet of distance between students/teacher as required by the CDC.
- Students will be instructed in how to safely space themselves when walking in the hallway or engaging in conversation in the classroom.
- Stairways will be marked as "one way" to maintain social distancing.
- One-way patterns will be established in the hallways.

Masks

- Students/teachers/ staff <u>will be required</u> to wear face masks or a face shield <u>to</u> school.
- Masks must be worn in the classroom, in the hallway, and in lavatories.
- Students may take a "mask break" while seated at their space in the classroom or outside the building when socially distant from others.





Cohort

- Students will be assigned to be together in a cohort.
- Some teachers may move to the cohort rather than the students moving to class.
- Students will eat with their cohort in the classroom and recreate at recess with their group.
- Students will have their own supplies to reduce the need to share.

Enhanced hygiene

- Students will be encouraged to wash hands frequently during the day.
- Hand-sanitizer will be available in the school building and in the classroom.
- Students are encouraged to bring a small size hand sanitizer for their own use and a water bottle to school, as drinking fountains will be used only as "filling stations".



Enhanced Cleaning

- High touch areas will be disinfected throughout the day.
- Classrooms and lavatories will be cleaned and "fogged" with a disinfectant spray each evening.
- Air filtration and HVAC systems upgraded to provide safe circulation of air in all areas.



Student Health

- Parents <u>are required</u> to monitor the health of their child/ren daily.
- Parents <u>are required</u> to complete a set of screening questions for each child each day. The school administration and school nurse will monitor the responses.
- Student temperatures will be taken daily as students enter the campus. A temperature of 100.4° or higher is considered significant and will result in calling a parent to take the child home.



Student Health

- Students will be monitored by the administration, teachers, and nursing personnel daily.
- Students who exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 will be isolated and cared for in a designated room away from the school population until they leave school with their parent or guardian.



Family Health

- Each family is required to report significant health concerns and any exposure to COVID-19 to the school nurse
- Parents who travel to states listed on the PA
 Department of Health website should voluntarily
 quarantine at home, away from their families for a
 period of 14 days.
- Monitor your child's activities and note children or adults with whom they may have had contact.
- Continue to engage children in conversation about the importance of caring for oneself and others.





Student Health

- Attention to understanding of current experience at every age level
- Opportunities to express concerns
- Attentive and compassionate listening morning meeting, recess chats
- Continued Communication with administration, parents, school counselor and nurse

Expectations for Online Learning as an option to Person to Person

- Lesson content, resources and student assignments posted on Schoology or SeeSaw for Grades ELC 3-8.
- Video stream via Zoom (K-8) at an age appropriate level
- Communication with student/parent as needed

Student will:

- Attend class daily dressed in school uniform in an environment free of distractions
- Participate in class, as appropriate
- Complete/submit student work and assignments
- Maintain communication with teacher(s) Student and/or parent



Health Expectations

Keep your child home if he/she is sick.

- Daily mandatory completion of screening questions
- Frequent hand washing
- Maintaining safe distance of 6 feet
- Wearing of a face mask at all times
